Twisted: Mindful Pretzel Consumption

Jill Marie (Sturgis) Thomas, of Lewisburg, is the author of *Twisted: Mindful Pretzel Consumption*, based on the history of America's first pretzel bakery. As the great-great granddaughter of Julius Sturgis, founder of the Julius Sturgis Pretzel Bakery in Lititz, Pennsylvania, and as a family owner of Tom Sturgis Pretzels in Reading, she has a lot to say about pretzel baking. The central Pennsylvania area is well known as the birthplace of the modern pretzel industry and is still a hub for pretzel baking. Since the mid-1800s, the pretzel industry has been a major part of Pennsylvania economics.

This informative and fun program is loaded with appealing visuals and hands-on pretzel twisting. An author book-signing opportunity follows the program.

Dale-Engle-Walker House Tours

The c.1793 limestone house was built by Ulster Scot immigrant Samuel Dale. Tours focus on the Dale family and their tenant farmers, the Engle's dairy farm, and the Walkers, as well as early Pennsylvania history and architecture.


The c.1789 Kantz Log Cabin is an example of early settlers' homes.

Also on site is the restored dairy shed, and a replica wagon shed displaying farm implements. Tours are free and open to the public. Books about the property and other topics of local history are available for purchase.

The Society is pleased to report that the Capital Campaign for improvements at the Museum and Gallery is progressing favorably.

Since the campaign was launched in November 2023, we have raised nearly \$68,000 toward our goal of \$200,000. We thank those individuals who have generously donated or pledged donations to the fund. Donors will be aknowledged in an upcoming newsletter.

With the funds that have been given, UCHS has

been able to make some important improvements at the Gallery property on Water Street. Construction of a spacious ADA compliant restroom was recently completed where the old restrooms had been. Lighting upgrades have also been made to enhace the space for exhibits and programs. Future plans include HVAC upgrades and further electrical system improvements on the property.





We are hoping to begin renovations next year of the main structure on Market Street – this inportant 3-story historic landmark building that will house the Union County Museum.



Book 2 of the Railroad History of the Area is on the Horizon!

While the east and west (Lewisburg, Centre and Hollidaysburg; Lewisburg, Centre and Spruce Creek; Lewisburg and Tyrone; Pennsylvania) Railroads took nearly fifty years to come to fruition (1836 to 1885), the north and south line (Shamokin, Sunbury and Lewisburg; Philadelphia and Reading; Reading) was conceived, chartered and built within a three year time period (1881 to 1883.) Why did it take so long for the first, and why was the second one built so quickly?



Railroads and Railroaders: North and South – The History of Lines That Operated in Central Pennsylvania addresses those questions. Book 2 in our series on central PA railroads presents the history of the railroads in Union County that ran along the West Branch and the connecting lines that went up to Eagles Mere, Newberry Junction and all the way to Tioga County. As the title suggests, the book has a primary focus upon the people who conceived the railroads, built them and travelled over them: the railroaders. It also provides stories of the equipment used to carry passengers and freight and the many towns that the trains passed through. Because of the unique position of the Newberry Junction, this book is one of the few histories that include all three main railroads that ran in the Eastern US: The Reading, Pennsylvania, and New York Central.

The north-south railroad book is in the final editorial process; publication by UCHS with support from the Central Pennsylvania

Chapter of the National Railroad Historical Society is planned for later this year or in 2025.

Railroads and Railroaders: East and West -AVAILABLE NOW-

focuses on the main railroad lines that ran east and west from Montandon to Tyrone, PA, the logging railroads, the narrow gauge lines from Winfield to New Berlin, and White Deer to Loganton, PA; and the Lewisburg, Milton and Watsontown trolley system. The book provides a detailed narrative with informative charts and astounding vintage photographs. Railroad History is Alive at the Tyrone Area Historical Society

One of the major railroads to operate through Union County was the old L&T, the Lewisburg and Tyrone Railroad. It operated over what is now our local Rails and Trails.

As part of their outreach, the Tyrone Historical Society has posted a number of video clips of current train traffic by their station on youtube: <u>Train Station Live Stream | Tyrone, Pennsylvania (youtube.com)</u>. In addition they have installed a live streaming camera to watch a view of a train roaring by. Take a look and see some impressive trains, and you can become a modern railfan! It is also a good way to introduce younger children and grandchildren to trains in action.

The history and numerous photographs of the L&T and the logging railroads that supplied their cargo is described in the UCHS book *Railroads and Railroaders: East and West*, which also covers the history of the New Berlin and Winfield Railroad, the White Deer and Loganton Railroad, the West Shore Railroad and the Lewisburg, Milton and Watsontown Trolley Railway.
